### GOVERNMENT & COMMERCE

Georgia is home to two Royal Danish Consulates located in Atlanta and Macon. The consulate in Atlanta is led by Consul S. Stephen Selig, III and the consulate in Macon is led by Consul Christopher N. Smith.

The Danish Trade commission in Atlanta is headed by Commissioner Jan Sauer. The DTC is a governmental entity commissioned by the Ministry of Foreign Affairs of Denmark to assist Danish firms with their internationalization efforts in the U.S. market.



The Danish-American Chamber of Commerce in Atlanta is a volunteer based network promoting organization founded and maintained on the initiatives of Danes and Americans living in Georgia.

### TRADE RELATIONSHIP



In 2008, Georgia exported more than \$112 million worth of goods to Denmark. Georgia leads among US states in exports to Denmark of preserved food, manmade filament and fabric, food waste and animal feed, and ores, slag, and ash. Georgia ranks second in exports of glass and glassware, toys and sports equipment, miscellaneous textile articles, and manmade staple fibers. Georgia is the third largest exporter of aircraft and spacecraft, ships and boats, books and newspapers, and miscellaneous manufactured articles.

Top imports from Denmark in 2008 included: machinery, electrical machinery, medical instruments and optics, furniture and bedding, and aircraft and spacecraft. Imports from Denmark totaled nearly \$131 million, a 6.8% increase from 2007.
