## U.S. Government Bid Opportunities

### African Development Bank Group

Procurement with the African Development Bank (ADB) is said to take on four considerations:

- Economy and Efficiency: The need for economy and efficiency in the implementation of projects including the provision of related goods and services.
- Fairness: Procurement procedures must give member countries adequate, fair, and equal opportunity to compete for contracts.
- Encouragement of the Development of Regional Members Countries contractors and suppliers: The Bank's interest, as a development institution in encouraging the development and participation of contractors and suppliers from regional member countries of the Bank.
- Transparency: Transparency is essential in the procurement process to achieve economy and efficiency and to combat fraud and corruption

Once the procurement web page has been accessed, two procurement notice options are available. Contractors have the choice of searching through "general procurement notices" by country or through "specific procurement notices" by country. "General procurement notices" are notices prepared by the borrower, which give simultaneous information on the project. "Specific procurement notices" are follow-ups of the general procurement notices Invitation to Bid, which give detailed information on a particular contract of a project under International Competitive Bidding.

Other procurement information, including procurement statistics, procurement reports, and quarterly summaries are accessible from the procurement web page.

- Next, select "Procurement notices" on the left side of the page, which will open to links for "General Procurement Notices" and "Specific Procurement Notices".

As well as securing the efficiency of the Bank's own projects, the implementation of projects based on EBRD's procurement policy and Rules promotes:

- The development, on a national level, of public procurement systems based on principles and procedures of highest international standard.
- The participation by foreign enterprises in EBRD-financed projects and greater involvement by the international business community in the Bank's countries of operations.
- The introduction of innovative solutions based on a strong private sector involvement in the provision of public services.

Procurement for state sector projects is normally carried out through open, competitive tendering. Only in exceptional circumstances are other procurement methods considered. For private sector operations, the client company or project sponsor is responsible for the procurement under the project. However, the bank will satisfy itself that private sector clients use appropriate procurement methods.

IFAD lists what goods it is calling for, whether or not this list changes or whether your company would fall under any of those categories should be investigated before serious procurement is sought. Such information is found by following the below-listed instructions.

Launched in 1997, Contracts Canada is a partnership of 23 federal departments and agencies. Their mandate is to improve supplier and buyer awareness and simplify access to federal government purchasing information. The Canadian federal government is a huge market for businesses large and small. As a supplier wanting to sell to the government, you need basic information on how the purchasing is done, who the contacts are and, most importantly, how you can find opportunities.

Register in the Supplier Registration Information (SRI) service as a potential supplier to the Government of Canada. SRI is used by federal government buyers to identify potential suppliers for purchases not subject to any of the trade agreements (for which they use MERX).

### **Value Added Services:**

Automatic Delivery of Amendments: Suppliers have the option to have all subsequent documents automatically delivered to them by email, fax or hardcopy. (Included in Complete Subscriber package)

The North American Development Bank (NADB) was created under NAFTA, in 1993, to address issues on the U.S./ Mexican border. NADB works in partnership with Border Environment Cooperation Commission. NADB is a bilaterally funded, internal organization capitalized by the United States and Mexican governments.

Potable water supply, wastewater treatment and municipal solid waste management form the core sectors of the NADB's activities and are its primary focus. However, assistance is also provided areas such as air quality, clean energy and hazardous waste where sponsors are able to demonstrate tangible health and/or environmental benefits for residents living in the area.

The United Nations procures requisite commodities through competitive solicitations from qualified vendors registered in the vendor roster of the Procurement Service. Depending upon the complexity of a requirement and the value of the commodity to be procured, the solicitation is issued as a Request for Proposal (RFP) or an Invitation to Bid (ITB) or as a Request for Quotation (RFQ). In specific, RFP's are issued when the requirements are not specified and price may be only one of other considerations in award of the Contract. ITB's are issued when the requirement is specific and evaluation of offers is based on price and other price related factors. RFQ's are issued for low value procurement normally where the requirement is specific and evaluation of offers is based on price and other price related factors.

As a general practice, most requirements above US\$25,000 are procured through either an RFP or ITB.

The United Nations procurement website offers a variety of links in conjunction with procurement. "Tenders" is an information-only link describing various projects. The "Expressions of Interest" link provides updates and guidelines concerning projects and is also, where the initial steps to contacting are taken. Before any action with the United Nations can be taken, businesses must register with the United Nations Procurement Service.

#### To Register:

- Select "UN Procurement" in the bottom center of the page.
- Select "Vendor Registration" on the top menu bar to begin the registration process.
- Select the link in the first paragraph in bold titled "United Nations Global Marketplace". This link will open to the Global Marketplace website with instructions for registering.

## World Bank

World Bank is made of two separate development institutions, the International Bank for Reconstruction and Development (IBRD) and the International Development Association (IDA). While doing business with the World Bank it is necessary to understand that the implementing agency in the recipient country is responsible for procurement. The Bank simply provides funds and acts as an overseer to the work.

The World Bank makes use of the Development Gateway Market (dgMarket) and the United Nations to advertise procurement opportunities. - The dgMarket provides information for various different banks and once the link is opened, procurement opportunities are listed according to category.
